ABORIGINAL FAMILY HISTORY

The Tasmanian Aboriginal Genealogical and Historical Association Submitted by Rod Drysdale

It is because many young Aboriginal people are forced to drop more of their cultural traditions, as well as the fact that our older people with knowledge of the past are leaving us, that this Association was formed.

The founding members are a mix of Tasmanian and Mainland Aboriginal people from every area of the State including the Bass Strait islands. All are dedicated to the collection and preservation of Aboriginal culture for the future generations of Australian Aboriginal children.

We have two main areas of interest, the first being the collection and recording of family genealogies and the second being the historical aspect of Aboriginal Australia.

The genealogical section is interested in obtaining family trees and genealogies for access by future generations of Aboriginal children. Dur concern is that some of the information collected and published in the past was not entirely correct. We are now working on correcting as much as possible in order that people making enquiries in the future will be given the right details. We are presently able to provide a significant amount of information to families in the process of tracing their own family background.

The historical aspect of the Association deals with all areas of Aboriginal history, both mainland and Tasmanian. Included in this broad area, is culture, language, art, religion, tools, any archaelogical sites, stories of events and people, in fact the whole range of possible aspects under history and culture.

It is hoped that by piecing together much of the knowledge held by Aboriginal people in the community we will be able to provide a strong centre for cultural identity within Tasmania.

THE MOLLISON GENEALOGIES

Early this year Bill Mollison agreed to make his entire collection of genealogical information, including letters and notes, available to this Association for its own use. He stated that he was aware that the works contain many mistakes and can only be corrected with the cooperation of the Aboriginal people themselves.

When asked how it was possible that so many mistakes were present, he stated that: "Much of the information was provided by family members

themselves. People were relying on memory or what somebody else had told them. Much of that information was found to be incorrect." He went on to say: "I don't believe that printing the genealogies was a bad thing though. What it did was start the ball rolling, even though it was not all correct." It is important for Aboriginal people to find their identity and I believe that this sort of thing helps. Aboriginal people can now continue and hopefully fix up those mistakes. "

PROBLEMS WITH EARLY RECORDS

Searching through official records for family information can be a very frustrating exercise, especially if you are looking for a name like Hearps, for example. Supposing the period you are searching is 1845, the individual is Harry Hearps. The owner of that name cannot read or write and therefore cannot tell whether his name is recorded correctly or not, and he married Hellen Hungerford - also illiterate.

The recorder would ask for both names and would probably write down the following:

Arrey, Larry or Harry EARPS married Ellen UNGERFUD.

Many of the early ancestors did not speak the Queen's English and most had a habit of dropping their hs.

Another problem with official records is the fact that many people didn't actually know how old they were and just took a stab at it when asked. Also many young men put their ages up when they got married. Some 18 year olds were 21 while some were "over 21".

There are many more traps for the novice and mastering research is a patient business.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Some archaeological information has been trickling in on the location of Aboriginal sites and artifacts. It is our intention to retain this information until some of our other Aboriginal organisations, who are working on policies for such material and information, have come to a final agreement. Meanwhile we are still seeking information.

LANGUAGE

One of the aims of this Association is to encourage some official or private work on the Tasmanian languages. At the same time, offer as much support to mainland people who are trying to have maintenance done on their own languages. Recently a petition was circulated calling on the Federal Government to contribute funds to the establishment of a language coordinating centre. Such support is vital if we are to maintain our culture for succeeding generations.

Recordings of the Tasmanian languages have been taken to the mainland and shown to Josie Farrer from the Kimberly Language Centre in W.A. Josie and several other Aboriginal people studied the recordings (in books) and within minutes were picking out words which were common to most Aboriginal people. The individuals involved with Josie were from several different
tribes and all spoke their own languages.

They confirmed that the languages recorded were genuine and that it would be possible to put together some workable sentences. They did agree that some of the spelling and interpretations were a little out, but that they could easily be corrected if it was done by Aboriginal people.

It is interesting to note that the writer has had several long arguments with professional white linguists on this point, and all but one stated that it would not be possible to do "anything at all" with the language. It would seem this is truly a matter for Aboriginal people to take up and correct. While others, whose profession it is to do such work have given up, the Aboriginal people still retain the eternal optimism which has allowed them to survive today.

GENERAL HISTORY AND STORIES

We are most interested in any bits and pieces of history or any stories which people might have. Even if it might appear insignificant it could be just the part of the jigsaw we have been waiting for. Whatever you might have and can write down, will be gratefully received. For example:

"My great grandfather had a farm below Kingston, near Oyster Cove, and I recall my grandfather saying that two Aboriginal families would come each winter and camp, one on each end of the verandah."

This might not seem much as far as information is concerned. However, it might be possible to identify those families and even find some sort of recorded information on them. Once it is established that someone did exist or that an event took place, it is possible to start searching for more information. A lead is all that is needed in some cases, and in this one we have a time period and a place. Others might know more, and slowly we can build up a profile.

PUBLICATIONS

The Association now has copyright to all of Bill Mollison's works. It is hoped that when the mistakes have been corrected, some genealogies will be republished. At present there is a strong request from the Briggs family to have their genealogies completed first. The task is a big one and we are doing our best, but at this stage we cannot say when any genealogies will be ready and which will be printed first.

SEARCH FEES

Our fees for searching are \$5 per hour and a flat \$5 for a computer printout showing details of your family tree. There is a need to provide money for petrol for private vehicles, electricity, phone calls, computer paper, stamps and envelopes, plus other odd expenses. At times it is even necessary to engage outside professional genealogists to assist with research. We hope that people will understand there is a need for a small fee. You would always be advised when a fee would be required.

COMPUTER PRINTOUTS

There are two types of printouts that can be given. One is a simple linetype printout showing basic family details and the other is a much more detailed book type printout. When a printout is available for a family the cost is \$5 for the line-type and a variable cost for the book.

Books are sold to individual family members and not published for general distribution. This arrangement suits the families who do not want their family details public knowledge. Also many details are often missing at the time of printing, which can be filled in later by those requesting the books.

Books can contain family and individual photos as well as a brief history on individuals if known. All requests for searches are confidential and our files are open only to members researching their own family tree.

I hope the information contained in these pages gives you some idea of what we do and why. We are always looking for support and are willing to help where possible.

Editor's Note: Mr Villy Scott, Librarian of the LDS Hobart Branch library, has kindly provided this information for us. For a complete description of the IGI see Neil Chick's article in "Tasmanian Ancestry" Vol 5, No 1. March 1984. This article will shortly be available as one of our "Research Notes" series, cost approx 50c.

The Genealogical department of the Church is a non-profit organisation supported primarily by the Tithing Funds of the Church. It is open to the public and there is no fee for using the research facilities, except a nominal charge to cover postage and copying.

The library is manned by volunteers, some full time, who are trained in research work. At the present time there are librarians working in the library who can read Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, German and Dutch.

The Genealogical Department has more than one and a half million rolls of microfilm as well as many thousands of books and microfiche at its head-quarters in Salt Lake City, Utah. The majority of this material can be read right here in this library. This material is taken from vital records in many countries of the world, such as church or parish registers containing records of births, marriages, deaths etc. from census, military, probate records and many more.

These films are ordered from the main Australian depository in Sydney where some stocks are kept, especially from the British Isles. If the film is not in Sydney, it will be ordered from Salt Lake City. Once a film is in Australia it stays here. This library holds vital records from the mainland states but not from Tasmania, as the Tasmanian records are readily available at the local libraries and Archives in Hobart.

This library also holds the latest edition of the IGI.

The General Society of Utah also invite the general public to participate in the worldwide "Family Register" (copy in this library) and the "Ancestoral File" which is now being compiled. Contact this library for more information.

The International Genealogical Index (IGI)

This Index is compiled by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, the 1984 edition contains 88 million names. A new edition is produced every 3 years and about 4 million names are added annually. There is no other genealogical research like it anywhere in the world and it is used by most researchers as the first steppingstone in compiling family histories. It can be used in the church's main library in Salt Lake City and in over 600 branch libraries in the world. It is also available in the libraries of most genealogical societies.

The names are collected from several sources, the main ones being:

1. Original records of births, christenings, marriages and deaths. They generally span a time period from 1500 to 1875. These names are collected and indexed by members of the church. The "Parish and Vital Records Listings" which is part of the IGI shows which records have been extracted, area and time period.

- Selected names submitted by church members containing names of relatives and ancestors.
- 3. Special selected church and temple records.
 The records are published on microfiche, small sheets of film containing about 22,000 names.

Each person is identified by parents or spouse as well as a place and time of event. There may be records of persons who have died recently. Generally christenings and marriages are recorded, but births are mostly recorded as christenings. If both birth and christening are given in the record the christening is recorded on the IGI. Deaths are rarely recorded.

The IGI is an index only, and not a primary record. All information should be verified from the original source, which can be found by using the Batch number found against each name. By using the batch number index it is possible to obtain a photocopy from the original source which sometimes enables you to contact other members of your family who are doing research work. It is possible to obtain the original record on microfilm and read it at this library. Names are collected from more than 90 countries.

Why does the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints spend so much money gathering genealogical records? And why do its members spend much of their time doing genealogical research?

The Church's primary interest in genealogical and family history stems from its deep concern for strong and lasting family relationships. Latter Day Saints believe that family life can be eternal, with family relationships continuing after death. Latter Day Saints identify family relationship and collect records of their ancestors as far back as they can trace them, then through sacred temple ordinances, these people are sealed together in families.

Introduction:

The IGI, formerly known as the Computer File Index (CFI), lists names found in the computer of the Genealogical Department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Genealogical Society of Utah). It does not include all information known about an individual but it uniquely identifies each person and gives a batch number that can be traced to the original input source.

The IGI can be used for at least four purposes:

- 1. To find genealogical information
- 2. To avoid duplication in research
- To determine if someone else is researching a given line.
 This is done by noting the batch number in the last two columns.
 (Not all the names in the IGI were compiled through genealogical research. The name may have been simply extracted as part of an indexing project.)

LAUNCESTON BRANCH

Recently, the Launceston Branch examined the possibility of obtaining indexes to St Catherine's House records which will become available later this year. The records required will provide information on all births recorded in England and Wales between 1837-1900 and will enable Tasmanian residents to locate records of forbears born in those areas during that period.

At the present time, to obtain these particulars, the researcher must either visit St Catherine's House in London personally, or pay very high search fees for the information.

We suggest that our central location in Tasmania will provide reasonable access to all Tasmanians interested in using the indexes. Our library hours are being expanded to cater for increased demand at the present time and we are prepared to open by arrangement, particularly for researchers from country areas and other parts of the state.

The cost of purchasing the records will be more than this branch can bear at present. Although our fund raising committee is working hard, our fund raising target is \$4000 which will purchase the birth records only. A similar amount would be required for marriage records at some time in the distant future.

We have now decided to ask members of the society and other interested persons if they would be prepared to make a donation to the Launceston Branch Library towards the purchase of the St Catherine's House birth indexes. These are in reels, each of which covers one quarter (3 mths) of a year. Each reel will cost seven English pounds which, at the current rate of exchange, will be approximately \$15.

We have already been promised donations by some members and would like to provide everyone interested in genealogy with the opportunity to subscribe towards the purchase of the records. Any such donations will be tax deductable. It is our intention to publish names of sponsors. Each person sponsoring the cost of one or more reels will be able to nominate the quarter(s) they might particularly require and we are prepared to provide that person with priority in the use of that reel(s) for a period of three months after its arrival. Every reel purchased will provide access to information that will not otherwise be available in this state. Your help would be very much appreciated. CARINS FAMILY CENTENARY

It is hoped that about 200 members of this family will gather for a reunion at Myrtle Park on 1 November 1986.

On 3 November 1886, William and Mary CARINS and their four small children, arrived in Launceston, Tasmania, having sailed from London 78 days earlier on the 'Gulf of St Vincent'. The Carins family came originally from the Newcastle-on-Tyne area and there are several families there to this day. They can be traced back nearly 300 years - the spelling is distinctive to that locality.

William and Mary belonged to the Society of Friends (Quakers). They purchased 90 acres of land at Myrtle Bank in Northern Tasmania on the then road through Lisle to Scottsdale. William was a scholar rather than a farmer, and he opened his first school there with three other families and his own children. He later became lecturer in Assaying, Mineralogy and Chemistry at the Launceston Technical School and then a teacher with the Education Department.

Mary was a naturally gifted nurse and was virtually regarded as the local doctor, walking many miles with her homeopathic medicines and saving more than one life.

Of their seven children, the three girls all became teachers. Violet m George <u>COOK</u> and lived at Longford: Nell m Frank <u>SAUNDERS</u> and lived in Adelaide and Launceston for a time; Kate taught in several northern schools and died of typhoid aged 25.

The sons were all on the land. John was at Nabowla, Tom at Winnaleah, George at Longford and Will at Myrtle Bank.

Unfortunately I no longer live in Cambridge and so cannot do research in exchange, but I have access to the 1851 census for the county and could provide data from that.

I do operate a search service for my index and will send all the entries for a surname for a nominal charge of 2 Aus \$ + 2 IRC (cheques in sterling or bills welcome), but of course would not charge anyone who was providing me with information.

I shall be most grateful if you could publish the relevant parts of this letter in your Journal."

Book Reviews

PIONEERS AT PIERMONT - Robert Webber and Family

By Frances Dorothy Travers. Printed by Elm and Ens Printing Service. 46 Wells Parade, Blackmans Bay and obtainable from the author. Cost \$25.

Most members of the Tasmanian Genealogical Society here in Hobart know Frances for her devoted work to the Society as past secretary and as a private researcher, and realise the difficulties she faced finding time for her own book.

It is with pride and pleasure that we are at last able to read this interesting and well balanced book of her husband's family, the Webbers.

The preface shows the deep feeling she has for her children's ancestors, her children's children and those to follow, resulting in her decision to record now what she has researched for many years.

The story has its beginning in Dorset, England and continues with the departure of the family to Van Diemen's Land in 1826.

Robert Webber built the first <u>Piermont</u> in 1827 and the remains of what is thought to have been the old kitchen still stand at the rear of the present well known Piermont of today, built in 1838 in the Swansea district on the east coast of Tasmania.

The author concludes her book with pedigree and family charts, making it easier for the reader to follow the family up to the present time, without the all too common habit of some family history books of over-crowding the latter part with up to date pictures of the present day generation. The index is a welcome addition, a help to readers and researchers alike.

"MAURITIAN HERITAGE" An anthology of the LIONNET, COMMINS and related families. Edited by Edward Duyker. Published by the Australian Mauritian Research Group, 28 Napoleon Road, Fern Tree Gully, Victoria 3156 and available from them. Price \$29.95 + \$4. postage and packing for 1-2 copies.

This handsome appendicated book, though not directly associated with Tasmania, should find a wide audience. Its 400 pages with 190 illustrations cover the countries of France, England, Mauritius and Australia.

The two families are Lionnet from 17th century France, including surgeons on the high seas, and Commins, printers in the 18th century from Dorset, England.

These two far flung families unite in Mauritius, an island in the Indian Ocean, and the story of their life on the island makes interesting reading.

The narrative follows several members of these families to Australia during the gold rush in the 1850's and their subsequent return to Mauritius.

The final chapters tell of the four couples who migrated to Australia during the post war years and their lives up to the present time, which have made a large contribution to the story of the twelve thousand Mauritians now living in Australia.

Those who read this compelling book can look forward to reading more about Mauritius in Edward Duyker's next book, soon to be published: "Of the Star and the Key: Mauritius, Mauritians and Australia". This book will cover aspects of trading between Mauritius and Van Diemen's Land, plus convict transportation in the 1800's.

Access to the libraries of some other societies has also been arranged on a reciprocal basis.

Application for Membership forms may be obtained from Branches or the GST Secretary and be returned with appropriate dues to a Branch Treasurer, or sent from out of state to the GST Treasurer, Box 640G, Hobart, Tas. 7001. Dues will also be accepted at Branch General Meetings or at the Libraries.

The MAIN Library is in the old Post Office at the corner of Cambridge Road and Queen Street, Bellerive, and other branches at Huonville, Launceston, Devonport & Burnie, also have libraries.
